Role of SACRES

- Every 5 Years review the syllabus ASC
- Advise on collective worship in School Assemblies
- Support Schools with delivery of RE including Teacher Training and Teaching Methods
- Consider issues relating to individual parents wishes
- Not all Schools are covered Faith Schools and Academies



SACRE Constitutions

- Constitution is determined by the LA this varies across the country
- The SACRE can only make recommendations to the LA It remains their decision
- Most SACREs meet 3 times a year once a term
- Decision making varies across the Country Group voting, individual votes or decision by consensus



Membership of SACREs 1

- The 4 Groups determined by the 1996 Act
 - Group A Christian and Other Religions (Numbers to reflect the religious make up of the Area)
 - Group B Church of England Because it is the 'Established Church'
 - Group C Teachers Representatives
 - Group D LA elected councillors



Membership of SACREs 2

- Also Co-opted Members and Observers appointed by the SACRE No Vote
- In attendance Clerk to the SACRE, RE Advisors and if necessary Legal Advisors
- SACRE Chairs -sometimes elected by SACRE Members, or appointed by LA (Often a Councillor)
- There are several SACREs where the Chair is a Humanist Bristol, Doncaster, LB Hounslow, York
- Size of SACREs vary widely



Top Tips for new Humanist Reps

- Don't rush in Take your time and assess how the SACRE works
- Try to build bridges talk to other Members
- You are not on your own HUK support SACRE Rep Code of Practice

Our aims on ASCs


- Inclusion
 - Humanism included to same extent as non-Christian religions
 - Inclusion in more than just the introduction in examples/units too
 - Inclusive language throughout
- Other important things
 - Making no assumptions e.g. that a god exists
 - Humanism rather than general non-religious worldviews
 - Avoiding misconceptions about non-religious worldviews
 - Framing humanism positively
 - Not just using humanism to learn more about religion
 - Link to Understanding Humanism
